

- DATE and TIME: record as day / month / year and hours / minutes.
- SPECIES: Identify the species using the identification keys. If the species not already listed on the form, list it under 'Other species'. State the species name and submit the form to strand.data@ehp.qld.gov.au.
- SEX and MATURITY: Where possible, identify sex (see key illustration for mammals) and maturity.
- TAGS: Record any tag number/s. Tags may be attached to the rear edge of the front flipper of turtles.
- LOCATION ACCURACY and DESCRIPTION: Be precise and use more than one line
  if necessary; e.g. North Stradbroke Island, eastern ocean beach, 5km south of
  Pt Lookout.
- CONDITION: Record the health/condition of the animal using the fields provided.
- FATE: Describe the steps taken to secure the animal to ensure it is not lost with currents or tides.

- DISPOSAL: Summarise how the carcass has been disposed of.
- DAMAGE and INJURIES: Describe any damage or injuries observed and their freshness. If you cannot take photos, use the diagrams on the form to sketch any damage or distinguishing marks.
- EXPERT ASSESSORS: Identify the veterinary and/or biological experts who examined the animal.
- NOTES: Address the full range of your observations. Attach extra pages if required.
