

**DISASTER MANAGEMENT WASTE - DECLARATION OF LIMITS
LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREA OF NOOSA SHIRE COUNCIL**

As Executive Director of the Office of Resource Recovery, Department of Environment and Science (the Department), and delegate to the chief executive of the Department, pursuant to section 27 of the *Waste Reduction and Recycling Act 2011* (the Act), I declare limits apply to disaster management waste in relation to the disaster situation declared by the Minister for Fire and Emergency Services for the area within the local government area of the Noosa Shire Council by gazettal in the Queensland Government Gazette volume 382 No. 73 on 8th November 2019 pursuant to section 64 of the *Disaster Management Act 2003*.

I declare that disaster management waste in relation to the above disaster situation is exempt waste subject to the limits stated in this declaration. It is declared that:

- a) waste is disaster management waste only for the period 8 November 2019 to and including 7 May 2020; and
- b) waste is disaster management waste only if it is disposed of at the following waste disposal sites:

Local government area	Waste disposal site
Noosa	– Eumundi Road Landfill (C109849)
Sunshine Coast	– Caloundra Landfill and Resource Recovery Centre (C109603) – Nambour Resource and Recovery Centre (C109726)
Gympie	– Gympie Waste Management Facility (C102777)

Definitions

“disaster management waste” means waste generated by or because of a disaster that is or has been the subject of a declaration of a disaster situation under the *Disaster Management Act 2003* but only within the limits, if any, declared by the chief executive, by publication on the department’s website, for a particular disaster.

This declaration of exempt waste is made on the date of publication on the department’s website.
