This passion for coaching led to a 15-year teaching career, where she is now Head of House and a Senior Health and Physical Education teacher at Moreton Bay College (MBC).

"Mathematics was not my strong suit and despite not being a maths teacher, she volunteered to tutor me during lunchtimes.

"Now as a teacher, I understand how rare and precious uninterrupted lunchtimes are. I am incredibly appreciative of the sacrifices she made to support me.

"This experience has inspired me to devote time and genuine care for every student I teach, ensuring they feel supported and encouraged in their academic journey."

For Carly, every day presents a new challenge and she finds it incredibly fulfilling to know she is making a difference in her students' lives.

"Every day is different, offering variety and the opportunity to play a role in shaping students' educational and post-schooling endeavours," she said.

"What makes it rewarding is past students making contact to thank me for the impact I had on their educational journey."

When asked what advice she would give students thinking of studying teaching, Carly commented that teaching is challenging, but immensely rewarding.

"Don't be afraid to ask for support. Collaboration and mentorship are key to growth and success in this profession."
