

**DISASTER MANAGEMENT WASTE - DECLARATION OF LIMITS  
DISASTER DISTRICT OF MARYBOROUGH**

As Manager of the Office of Resource Recovery, Department of Environment and Science (the department), and delegate to the chief executive of the department, pursuant to section 27 of the *Waste Reduction and Recycling Act 2011* (the Act), I declare limits apply to disaster management waste in relation to the disaster situation declared by the Minister for Fire and Emergency Services for the area within the Disaster District of Maryborough (made up of the Fraser Coast Local Government Area) by gazettal in the Queensland Government Gazette volume 389 No. 35 on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2022 pursuant to section 64 of the *Disaster Management Act 2003*.

I declare that disaster management waste in relation to the above disaster situation is exempt waste subject to the limits stated in this declaration. It is declared that:

- a) waste is disaster management waste only for the period 27 February 2022 to and including 26 August 2022; and
- b) waste is disaster management waste only if it is disposed of at the following waste disposal sites:

**Definitions**

“disaster management waste” means waste generated by or because of a disaster that is or has been the subject of a declaration of a disaster situation under the *Disaster Management Act 2003* but only within the limits, if any, declared by the chief executive, by publication on the department’s website, for a particular disaster.

This declaration of exempt waste is made on the date of publication on the department’s website.
