Plus for the major Section		Those who have not achieved a Bronze Level must complete an additional 6 months in either Skills, Voluntary Service or Physical Recreation
Adventurous Journey	2 days + 1 night	3 days + 2 nights
Note: The Adventurous Journey Section is comprised of 3 parts: preparation and training; at least one Practice Journey (not required for Bronze Level); and the Qualifying Journey, with minimum time requirements.		
Minimum age to start	14 years ¹	15 years ²
Maximum age to start	24 years and 6 months	24 years (direct entrants)
Minimum duration to finish a Level (without exception)	3 months	Bronze Level Achievers: 6 months Direct entrants: 12 months

¹ At Bronze Level, if a person is aged 13 but part of a school year/ peer group where the majority are 14 years or older that young person can start their Bronze Level with the rest of the group upon the approval of the Duke of Ed Leader.

² If the young person is a direct entrant to Silver, they must be 15 years old to start The Duke of Ed. A young person may commence Silver earlier than 15 years old if they have completed their Bronze Level upon approval by their Duke of Ed Leader.

BLUE CARD

Under the Working with Children (Risk Management and Screening) Act 2000 people working with children under 18 years of age will need a working with children check (blue card) if they are providing services or activities to children in certain regulated categories of employment or business. This applies to employees and/or volunteers associated with The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award and Bridge Award programs. Employers and businesses providing regulated child-related services are also required to have a child and youth risk management strategy in place to protect children and young people from harm.
